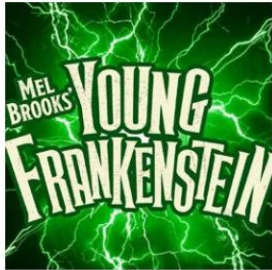
NEWSIES (PG)



Set in turn-of-the-century New York City, *Newsies* follows a ragtag band of teenage newspaper sellers, the “newsies,” led by charismatic orphan Jack Kelly. When powerful newspaper publisher Joseph Pulitzer raises the price they must pay for their papers, Jack rallies the kids to strike with the help of plucky young reporter Katherine Plumber, demanding fair treatment and respect. As they organize a citywide strike, they fight not only for better wages but also for dignity, solidarity, and hope in a harsh world. Along the way there’s friendship, courage, music, and the belief that united, even scrappy kids can stand up to power and “seize the day.”

YOUNG FRANKENSTEIN the Musical (PG-13)



Frederick Frankenstein, brilliant scientist and proud descendant of Dr. Victor von Frankenstein, is determined to escape his family’s grisly legacy — even demanding his name be pronounced “Fronken-steen.” After inheriting his grandfather’s looming castle in Transylvania, Frederick reluctantly travels there with his devoted servant Igor and his eager lab assistant Inga. Once inside the castle’s creepy labs and under the watchful eye of the ominous Frau Blucher, Frederick gives in to destiny and attempts his grandfather’s infamous experiment. Chaos, romance, and madcap comedy follow as his newly animated creature proves more misunderstood than monstrous, forcing Frederick to rethink legacy, identity, and what “normal” really means.

Travel through four unforgettable decades of rock and roll as the Bigfork Summer Playhouse takes you on an up-close, high-energy musical journey through the Hits of the 50’s, 60’s, 70’s, and 80’s. With staged favorites made famous by artists like The Ronettes, Chuck Berry, Elvis Presley, Billy Joel, The Four Seasons, The Spaniels, Elton John, Cyndi Lauper, The Big Bopper, and many more, the BSP company brings each era to life in a way that feels personal, playful, and full of vintage charm. *Featuring a refreshed lineup different from last summer’s show, it’s a nostalgic ride through the music that shaped generations.*

THE MUSIC MAN (G)



The Music Man tells the story of Professor Harold Hill, a smooth-talking traveling salesman who rolls into the small town of River City, Iowa in 1912 and convinces the townspeople to buy instruments and uniforms for a boys’ marching band — despite the fact that he can’t teach music and plans to skip town with their money. As he works his scam, the skeptical librarian Marian Paroo sees through him, but when Harold helps her shy brother gain confidence and begins to fall for Marian himself, he starts to rethink his plans. In the end, his charm and the town’s new band unite the community in a celebration filled with heart, laughter, and a touch of romance.

MEAN GIRLS (PG-14)



Cady Heron, newly arrived from being home schooled in Africa, enters a suburban Illinois high school and befriends outsiders Janis Sarkisian and Damian Hubbard. They persuade her to infiltrate “the Plastics,” the school’s powerful trio led by ruthless “queen bee” Regina George. As Cady becomes more entangled with them, she begins losing her true self, betraying her friends and even her crush for popularity. When Regina retaliates with the infamous “Burn Book” and chaos erupts, Cady hits rock bottom. In the end, she must repair friendships, own up to her mistakes, and rediscover who she is in this cautionary tale of peer pressure, identity, loyalty, and the perils of teenage popularity.
