Newsies (PG)

Newsies tells the inspiring story of Jack Kelly, a charismatic newsboy in turn-of-the-century New York City who leads a ragtag group of fellow newspaper sellers when powerful publishers raise the price they must pay for papers. Faced with unfair conditions, Jack and the newsies band together, organize a strike, and learn the strength of solidarity as they fight for justice and a better future.

Young Frankenstein (PG-13)

Young Frankenstein follows Frederick Frankenstein, the skeptical American grandson of the infamous Dr. Victor Frankenstein, who travels to Transylvania to claim his inherited family estate. Reluctantly embracing his legacy with the help of his quirky assistant Igor, lab aide Inga, and the eerie housekeeper Frau Blücher, Frederick resumes his grandfather's experiments and brings a creature to life. What ensues is a monstrously funny journey of mishaps, misunderstandings, and madcap mayhem as Frederick learns to balance science, love, and what it truly means to follow in the footsteps of a legendary—if slightly alarming—ancestor.

The Music Man (G)

The Music Man follows charismatic traveling salesman Harold Hill, who rolls into River City, Iowa, in 1912 and convinces the townspeople to buy instruments and uniforms for a boys' marching band — despite the fact that he can't actually teach music. As his scheme unfolds, Hill's plans to take the money and run are complicated when he falls for the skeptical librarian Marian Paroo and begins to genuinely care about the town and its people. Songs like *76 Trombones*, *Goodnight My Someone*, *My White Knight*, and *Shipooi*.

Mean Girls (PG-14)

Adapted from the hit 2004 comedy, *Mean Girls: The Musical* follows Cady Heron, a teenager who has grown up being homeschooled in Africa and thinks she's ready for anything — until she enters the jungle of suburban American high school. With help from her new friends Janis and Damian, Cady navigates cliques, confronts the reigning "Queen Bee" Regina George and her Plastics, and gets swept up in the social politics of popularity. As Cady climbs the ladder of high-school status, she learns hard lessons about friendship, loyalty, identity, and being true to herself.
